ensuring their workforce is performing at its best and beyond.

These enlightened companies are now finding that by creating the best possible work environment, employees respond with increased productivity. One may be forgiven for thinking this could be summed up by the pithy old term "a happy workplace is a profitable workplace", but this goes much deeper.

This new thinking addresses key areas such as physical location, staff health and working environment, and the way operations are run. And it is backed by science.

Businesses are enjoying the results that addressing these issues can have, such as cutting the basic costs of running a business, having more contented and productive staff, improving the company's brand image and attracting new clients, which all results in a healthier, more profitable business.

Leaving the 'Big Smoke'

Central to much of this, is location. Cities are becoming more expensive, more polluted, and more stressful places in which to work.

Businesses today are bound by environmental legislation to limit their 'carbon footprint', something that is becoming increasingly difficult to do in older buildings and using an infrastructure that is under increasing strain.

In fact, the World Health Organization estimates that around 10% of all harmful 'greenhouse gas' emissions are produced by commercial property in towns and cities.

An increasing number of leading companies are therefore starting to move to out-of-town locations, where facilities can be purpose-built to meet the latest environmental regulations, as well as being able to make use of the most fuel efficient operating systems, such as air conditioning, lighting and heating.

Scandinavian countries have been at the forefront of such moves for several years now, so it is no surprise that two

of the world's most modern and successful companies, Google and Facebook, recently chose such sites in Finland and Sweden, respectively, to be headquarters of their European datacentre hubs.

The Great Outdoors

Of course, these leading companies did not move to these sites in the country just to be able to build more efficient and cheaper-to-run premises. There is increasing evidence that employee productivity is

enhanced by a 'greener', more natural environment.

Much of this is down to a gathering consensus on the importance of a 'work-life' balance. Referring again to our Scandinavian cousins, a recent survey by the US *Atlantic* magazine of countries where this balance was best,

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placed Denmark, Sweden, Norway and Finland all in the top seven.

Science also backs the view that employees work better in a rural environment. Professor Roger Ulrich, a world expert on the benefits of natural 'green' space, carried out a ground-breaking study of the effects of locating hospitals in the countryside. Not only did he find that patients benefited from the more relaxing surroundings, he also discovered benefits in staff costs and productivity.

Prof Ulrich found that employees reported that they were happier at work, days lost to staff sickness were significantly reduced, and that workers were more effective at their jobs.

This led not only to better a experience and health results for the patients, but it also saved the hospitals money as businesses, thus making them run more profitably. Such results have been repeated elsewhere. Recently in Melbourne, Australia, companies who enrolled with the city's Green Building programme found that staff productivity increased by 10.9%.

Green Business Benefits

The growth in importance of environmental issues has had a real impact on business today. Companies can expect more environmental legislation to have an effect on running costs, but also, in many places, they are encouraged to take on board ecofriendly practices and systems, sometimes even via tax breaks.

For companies that espouse and practice green policies, studies show there is also an emerging market in clients who are more inclined to do business with those that are more environmentally involved.

Research is also showing that employee loyalty can be boosted if a company is

more environmentally aware, attracting a better calibre of employee. US staffing firm Adecco reports that one-third of prospective employees are more inclined to work for a company they deem 'green'.

And of course, publicity helps in this respect. A good press, highlighting a company's 'green' credentials, is becoming increasingly beneficial to business, which is why a CSR (Corporate Social Responsibility) programme is now a must for many businesses.

All in all, it can make a great deal of business sense for companies to move out of the city and set up in modern 'green' workplaces, where costs can be drastically reduced and productivity can be vastly improved.

And the more our expensive, polluted and gridlocked our urban areas become, the more sense it will make...
